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## *The Obituary*

Holly entered into Heaven to be with God on April 9th, 2024 at the age of 54. She was born in North Miami, Florida on December 21, 1969, was educated and lived most of her life in that area, mainly in the cities of Hollywood and Davie. Her maternal grandmother stated before Holly was born that God was sending this child into the world with a significant purpose and at the age of 16 she began her career working in the medical field as Office Manager of psychiatric and psychological offices. Right up to the time of her passing, Holly loved and cared for her patients.

On September 19, 1992, Holly married Patrick E. McAneny, moving to a new home in Davie for the beginning of a loving and happy life of marriage for over 31 years. Two loving sons were born, Patrick Jr. on December 4th, 1996 and Zachary, February 13th, 2001.

Holly was an active member in the Episcopal churches of St. James in-the Hills of Hollywood, St. Mark's of Ft. Lauderdale, and All Saints of Morristown, TN. She served her Lord as a church schoolteacher, EYC leader, ECW member, and Lay Eucharistic Minister. After a journey to the Holy Land in 2014, Holly discerned and was admitted to The Order of The Daughters of the King in 2015. She lived a life true to her vows of Prayer, Service, and Evangelism, habitually wearing her cross as a habit.

Holly, along with her beloved husband and family, did not wait for retirement as planned, but moved to Tennessee in 2020 where she continued working until she passed away. Holly was a committed loving servant of her Lord in all her relationships and professional work. She will be greatly missed by her family and by a whole host of friends and people who were privileged to know her. May light perpetual shine upon her and may she rest in peace.
