THE EPISTLE EPHESIANS 2:11-22

A Reading from Paul's letter to the Ephesians.

Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called "the uncircumcision" by those who are called "the circumcision" —a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

37Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food ...? 40And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family,* you did it to me." (Matt. 25)

Before Covid, many churches, including our own, took heed to what Jesus said in the above passage and contributed food to the various food banks. Food insecurity still exists. It is time for St. James to get back out into the mission field and participate in God's mission in the world. Let us restart that which we so joyously saw as God's call to us. This is not a hard ministry and would take only a couple of folks who are dedicated to it. We can choose which Hollywood food bank we will participate with, or "share the wealth" and bring food to all of them! That would be up to the ones who feel called to this important response to Jesus: Lord, when did we see you hungry and gave you food? Please see Fr. HIDDEN TREASURES: Discovering The Hymnal

Hymn 664- My Shepherd Will Supply My Need- was written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748). Watts is rightfully considered the father of English hymnody. RESIGNATION, the tune to which this hymn is sung, is a nineteenth-century tune from southern Appalachia. All three-poet, psalm, and music-unite this hymn to give us a new vision of the providence of God. Isaac Watts, the English Congregational minister, theologian, and writer, was a prolific hymnodist who penned about six hundred sacred songs, forever changing the course of English-language hymnody. Hymn 664 dates from Watts's 1719 collection, Psalms of David, and concludes with his remarkable interpretation of the psalm's last verse: "No more a stranger or a guest, but a child at home."
