THE HOLY GOSPEL JOHN 6:1-21

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so

also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.



37Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food ...? 40And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family,* you did it to me." (Matt. 25)

Before Covid, many churches, including our own, took heed to what Jesus said in the above passage and contributed food to the various food banks. Food insecurity still exists. It is time for St. James to get back out into the mission field and participate in God's mission in the world. Let us restart that which we so joyously saw as God's call to us. This is not a hard ministry and would take only a couple of folks who are dedicated to it. We can choose which Hollywood food bank we will participate with, or "share the wealth" and bring food to all of them! That would be up to the ones who feel called to this important response to Jesus: Lord, when did we see you hungry and gave you food? Please see Fr. Joseph if you would like to help coordinate this effort.

HIDDEN TREASURES: Discovering The Hymnal

Hymn 644- 'How Sweet the Name of Jesus Sounds' was written by John Newton (b. London, England, 1725; d. London, 1807). Newton was born into a Christian home, but his godly mother died when he was seven, and he joined his father at sea when he was eleven. His licentious and tumul-tuous sailing life included a flogging for attempted desertion from the Royal Navy and captivity by a slave trader in West Africa. After his escape he himself became the captain of a slave ship. Several factors contributed to Newton's conversion: a near-drowning in 1748, the piety of his friend Mary Catlett, (whom he married in 1750), and his reading of Thomas à Kempis' Imitation of Christ. In 1754 he gave up the slave trade and, in association with William Wilberforce, eventually became an ardent abolitionist. With the heading "The Name of Jesus," this text was published in the Olney Hymns (1779), where it was part of a group of hymns inspired by scriptural passages. The text is a fine example of Newton's evangelical piety and his skill at incorporating biblical phrases or allusions into his hymn texts. Newton said that Song of Songs 1:3 ("Your name is like perfume poured out") was the inspiration for this text. Stanzas 1 and 2 compare perfume, with its sweet fragrance and healing properties, to the name of Jesus, which "soothes" and "heals." With its

many biblical names for the Savior, stanza 3 evokes a variety of images about the person and ministry of Christ. The final stanzas confess that though our worship of Christ may be weak and imperfect, we will use our resources to praise Him and testify to His love.
