

HIDDEN TREASURES: Discovering The Hymnal

Hymn 514- 'To Thee, O Comforter Divine' was written by Frances R. Havergal. She was born in 1836 and died in 1879. Miss Havergal's scholastic acquirements were extensive, embracing several modern languages, together with Greek and Hebrew. She does not occupy, and did not claim for herself, a prominent place as a poet, but by her distinct individuality she carved out a niche which she alone could fill.

Simply and sweetly, she sang the love of God, and His way of salvation. To this end, and for this object, her whole life and all her powers were consecrated. She lives and speaks in every line of her poetry. Her poems are permeated with the fragrance of her passionate love of Jesus. Her religious views and theological bias are distinctly set forth in her poems. The burden of her writings is a free and full salvation, through the Redeemer's merits, for every sinner who will receive it. Her life was devoted to the proclamation of these truth by personal labors, literary efforts, and earnest interest in foreign missions. (Rev. James Davidson, B.A)
