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The Obituary

Marie Henderson-Williams, beloved wife, mother, sister, and friend, passed away peacefully, leaving behind a legacy of laughter, love, and memories that will be cherished forever. Born on July 24, 1945, in Kingston, Jamaica, she was the second of nine children to her mother, Christine Francis. Her mother, her brothers Steve and Ernest Francis, and her sisters Flo Williams and Vivene Francis-Northover preceded her in death.

Marie migrated to the United States in the early 1970s and initially worked in New York's hospitality industry. Her career took a remarkable turn when she secured her dream job with American Express, first in New York and later transferring to the company's Florida branch in Plantation. She proudly served in many departments and finally in the Subpoena department, and her role afforded her the exciting opportunity to travel to India, where she trained employees.

An avid traveler, Marie shared an annual tradition with her sister, Pamela, exploring Europe and visiting the storybook towns they'd read about. Her passion for exploration and love for culture left her with memories of vibrant journeys.

Marie was also a devoted member of St. James in-the-Hills Church, actively serving in the Altar Guild Ministry for many years. Her faith and dedication touched many lives.

Her honesty, infectious laughter, and humor were unforgettable. Known for her straightforward nature, she often said, "If you don't want the truth, don't ask me." She was a talented cook, a skill she mastered as the second of nine children. Though her love for cooking faded in later years, her zest for life never did. She enjoyed English mysteries, comedies, and cooking shows and loved to dance, especially to Soca music.

Marie leaves behind her loving and devoted husband, James Williams; her cherished son, Ricardo Francis; her siblings, Pamela (Bertram) Johnson, Hugh Francis, Yvonne (Rodney) Paicely, and Claudette (Michael) Crowder-Fowler; and a host of nieces, nephews, and friends who will forever remember her warmth and grace.

She was nourished with your Body and Blood; grant her a place at the table in your heavenly kingdom.

Hear us, Lord.

Comfort us in our sorrows at the death of our sister; let our faith be our consolation, and eternal life our hope.

Silence is kept.

The Priest concludes with the following prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to you our sister Marie who was reborn by water and the Spirit in Holy Baptism. Grant that her death may recall to us your victory over death and be an occasion for us to renew our trust in your Father's love. Give us, we pray, the faith to follow where you have led the way; and where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, to the ages of ages.

People: Amen.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen*.

By 11:00 o'clock, I was tired and weary from my cleaning, and extremely disappointed that they had not turned up. So, I packed up and took off back home!

The following day - Sunday - all three of us were at church. I then discovered that they had entered the church through the back door, gathered the silver, and spent hours in the kitchen polishing all our lovely items. Marie was the one who took charge of arranging Saint Anne's Guild baskets, which we sold to fund the projects which the Guild supported. We always ended up with an attractive product because of Marie's commitment to beauty and quality.

Those baskets helped Saint Anne's Guild purchase the white chairs for Feaster Hall. Whenever you are in the hall, remember that Marie was instrumental in providing a necessary, practical and long-lasting gift to the church she faithfully attended for so many years.

As a former Altar Guild Directress, who worked with Marie for many years, I remember her commitment to the Altar Guild and her faithful service over the many years that she served. May her soul and the souls of all the departed rest in peace and may light perpetual shine upon her.
