

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.





HIDDEN TREASURES: Discovering The Hymnal

Hymn 556-Rejoice, Ye Pure in Heart was written by Anglican priest and professor Edward Hayes Plumptre (1821-1891) as a processional hymn for a choir festival in one of England's majestic places of worship, Peterborough Cathedral. Plumptre was a distinguished scholar of his day, receiving his ordination in the Anglican Church in 1846.

Of the original 11 stanzas, five or six stanzas appear in most hymnals.
