#### 5. SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

2023 Budget

Balance Sheet

St. James had net income of \$30,039 in 2022 compared to a budgeted net loss of \$67,457. The net income of \$30,039 was \$97,496 better than the budget primarily due to lower clergy costs of \$44,678 due to Father Guy being called to a different service by God in June 2022 and \$42,750 of higher than anticipated daycare income. The daycare income totaled \$82,750 in 2022.

The 2023 budgeted net income of \$40,625 is \$10,586 higher than the 2022 actuals due to an anticipated increase in daycare income of \$25,250, partially offset by higher expenses of approximately \$19,000. The budget assumes a new priest will start on July 1, 2023.
